Online Entry Registration Instructions

Open Feb. 28 – May 30.

**Artwork must be registered online
BEFORE being brought to the Fair.**

Be sure your school is set up with the Fair's Competitive Exhibits Office PRIOR to Entry Registration:

- 1) Click here for [ONLINE ENTRY REGISTRATION](#) .
A button is also available in the Jr./Sr. High School Art Show section of the Fair's [Exhibit Entries](#) web page.
- 2) Click **Sign In** at the upper right corner of the page
- 3) Choose **Type: School** or **Quick Group** and follow the instructions.
PLEASE NOTE: Teachers may use **School** login and password from last year. **However**, if there are multiple teachers at your school accessing online entry registration, we ask that **each teacher** create their own **Quick Group** and password. Use the teacher's full name (first and last) for **Group User Name**.
- 4) Click **Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries**. Enter Exhibitor's (student's) information. *Use the School or Quick Group password when inputting each student's information.*
- 5) Click **Continue** to go to **Create Entries**.
For each entry:
 - Select a **Department** ex.: Jr/Sr High Art Show
 - Select a **Division** ex.: Jr/Sr Drawing
 - Select a **Class** ex.: class 01 - Chalk Pastel
 - Fill in all requested information for the class you are entering.
ex.: **Title:** *Water Lily*
Description: *blue flower on black paper, blue mat, frame with glass, 11"x14"*
- 6) When each Exhibitor's (student's) entry information is complete, click **Add Entry to Cart**.
You may now **Add Entries for a different Exhibitor (student)** or **Check Out**.
(NOTE: If you think you may want to modify your entries, you may save your current session and check out at a later session. Be sure to Check Out before the closing date listed; entries are not submitted to the Fair office until the check-out process is complete.)
- 7) When all Exhibitor entry registrations are complete, follow instructions to **Check Out**. Fill in "yes" to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in the Premium List and click **Submit**.

Washington State Fair JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW

Aug. 31- Sept. 23, 2018
(closed Tuesdays & Sept. 5)

The Washington State Fair is pleased to offer young artists from the Northwest an opportunity to showcase their best work at the Fair's 30th annual Junior/Senior High School Art Show. Students, **grades 6-12 enrolled in a middle school, junior high, high school or homeschool equivalent**, are invited to participate in what many consider to be the area's most prestigious show for the artistic community's younger generation. Thousands of people will view your students' artwork during the 20 days of the Fair.

JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW ENTRY GUIDELINES

- All work must be done exclusively by the student entrant, **grade 6-12 enrolled in a middle school, junior high, high school or homeschool equivalent**, within the current school year.
- All work should be designated by the student with their **name and title on the back** prior to arrival. Remove all name tags from prior shows.
- **Please limit student work to one piece per teacher, per class or discipline.** (Korum Scholarship is an exception).
- For the protection of your work, all **entries must be delivered in a portfolio or container suitable for storage and repacking** after the Fair. School and teacher names must be printed clearly on the outside of portfolios and containers.
- Register entries online for each piece of artwork (see page 3 for instructions.) **We cannot guarantee against spelling errors. Please type carefully and use proper case for names and titles** when registering entries online; this is the source for both display tags and catalog.
- All work must stay in the show the full run of the Fair, Aug. 31 – Sept. 23, 2018.
- Entries cannot be accepted or returned by mail or common carrier.
- **All work must be titled!** "Untitled" is not allowed as a title in the show. **Untitled work will be retitled under the discretion of the superintendent or rejected at check -in.** We encourage that titles should be unique and individual, and **please keep them short.**

- All work must be suitably matted and ready to hang. Frames are not required. Work not properly assembled or that becomes disassembled during hanging will not be displayed. Avoid using temporary adhesive materials such as tape, glue stick, etc. All works should be matted as one individual unit.
- All framed work needs to have appropriate hanging hardware.
- **3D work must be designed to hang!** Works such as masks, ceramics, mobiles and collages must have hangers attached with a hiding spot for Entry Form. All new 3D considerations will be reviewed during take in. **Please contact Mike Hollins (mikehollins@gmail.com) well in advance for consent.**
- Any work deemed too heavy for safe display will not be accepted, at the discretion of show management.
- All pencil, charcoal, chalk and pastels must be fixed or sealed. Areas may be available for spraying during take in. **All work must be dry at take-in.**
- Although every precaution will be made to protect the art pieces, the Washington State Fair will not be responsible for theft, loss or damage to entries.
- The Fair reserves the right to reject any work it finds objectionable.

JUDGING & AWARDS

The Fair wishes to recognize the effort our region's young artists put into their work. Toward that end, the judging and award structure for the Jr/Sr High School Art Show has been changed. The goal of these changes was to encourage:

- overall program participation
- quality of work
- a diverse representation of the region's student artwork

JUDGING AND RIBBONS

Artwork will be evaluated by grade level within each division and class, and judged on the following criteria:

- use of medium
- originality / creativity
- composition / design
- technical / craftsmanship

Professional artists will jury the open class entries and also select the placing for each class and the best of show for each division.

Each class may have a first, second, third and honorable mention placing/ribbon. There will be two Best of Show rosette awards for each division (one for grades 6-8 and one for grades 9-12.) Some divisions/classes may not have entries or win awards.

Up to 10 ribbons will be awarded for Most Patriotic art pieces.

Fair guests will award the daily People's Choice ribbon through ballots. Ribbons will be awarded for daily People's Choice and Overall People's Choice Grand Champion.

PARTICIPATION PREMIUMS

To encourage a diverse field of competition, participating schools and homeschool groups will have the opportunity to win cash premiums.

Middle, Junior and High Schools:

Participation premiums will be awarded based on minimum participation requirements, and evaluated on: number of entries submitted, placings awarded, and percentage of participation in total show. An art teacher (program coordinator) will be eligible for a \$100 cash premium, to be used for the arts at their school, based on participation and award points (limit of one cash premium per teacher.) Up to 10 cash premiums are given for High Schools and 10 for Junior High / Middle Schools.

Homeschools:

The top two individual homeschool students with the highest placing and judges score overall in the competition will receive \$50 each for their participation. **Homeschool students must provide an address to receive a prize check.**

KORUM FAMILY ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

Held in conjunction with the Jr/Sr High School Art Show, this special competition is **only open to high school juniors and seniors** (2017-2018 school year.)

Entries should **showcase** the uniqueness of Washington state - share what makes Washington special to you. **One entry per student.**

Entries submitted to the Korum Family Arts Scholarship Competition are **additional** to the Jr/Sr High School Art Show and will be judged separately. The same piece may not be entered in both shows.

Please gauge your choice of DIVISION & CLASS by determining the most dominant medium used in creating the art piece. **Entries which are either untitled, mislabeled, entered in the wrong Division or Class, or inappropriately entered in "Other" classes will be required to be corrected by entrant at check-in or it may be rejected.** "Other" classes should not be used as a "catch-all. All other classed work will be designated upon drop off."

Please note: Some Divisions & Classes judged by grade level may not contain artwork. Some juried Divisions & Classes may not be awarded placings or ribbons.

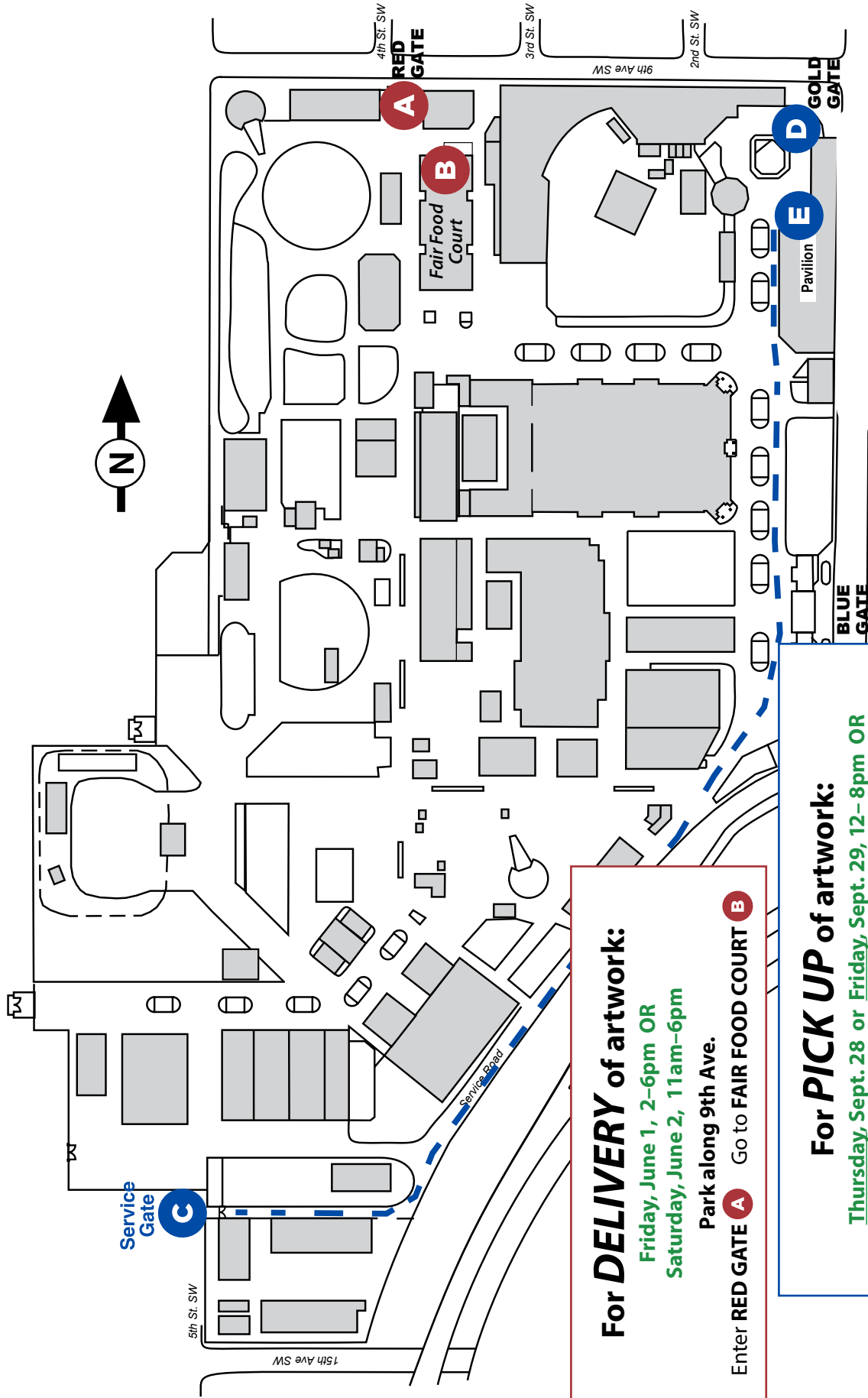
